

Salvation to Surrender: A Journey of Redemption

A Ministry Partnership Narrative

WHY THIS STORY

At the heart of *Salvation to Surrender* is a question the Church has been wrestling with for generations:

What does it truly mean to follow Christ after salvation?

This story was created out of a conviction that faith is not meant to stop at belief, but to continue into a daily, often difficult process of surrender. It explores the inner tension many believers experience—between receiving grace and resisting the transformation that grace invites.

Rather than offering quick answers or polished spirituality, *Salvation to Surrender* approaches faith with honesty, humility, and reverence. It portrays brokenness not as failure, but as the very place where God’s work becomes visible. Our desire is to create a story that resonates with those inside the Church, while remaining accessible to those standing just outside it.

A SHARED HEART FOR DISCIPLESHIP

This project aligns closely with the mission many ministries carry: helping people move from surface-level faith into deeper discipleship.

The film does not preach, instruct, or moralize. Instead, it creates space for reflection—allowing viewers to see themselves in the struggle, resistance, and eventual yielding that surrender requires. We believe stories like this can soften hearts, open conversations, and invite people to engage faith more honestly than traditional teaching alone sometimes allows.

Our prayer is that *Salvation to Surrender* becomes a tool ministries can use to:

- Encourage spiritual self-examination
 - Spark meaningful discussion
 - Walk alongside individuals navigating doubt, repentance, or renewal
 - Reinforce that surrender is not loss, but freedom

HOW WE SEE MINISTRY PARTNERSHIP

We are not approaching ministries to “fund a film,” but to **stand alongside a story** that reflects shared values and spiritual concerns.

A ministry partner is invited to:

- Affirm the heart and intent of the project
- Help share the story with their community
- Host screenings or facilitated discussions when the film is released
- Use the film as a conversation starter within their existing discipleship or outreach efforts

Partnership can look different for each organization, and there is no single expectation or obligation. Our goal is alignment, not pressure.

STEWARDING THE WORK WELL

The film is being produced independently and responsibly, with a strong emphasis on stewardship, accountability, and transparency. We have intentionally chosen a lean production model so the focus remains on story, performance, and impact rather than scale or spectacle.

By keeping the production disciplined, we are protecting the integrity of the message and ensuring the film can reach audiences without compromise.

LOOKING TOWARD IMPACT

Our hope is that *Salvation to Surrender* lives beyond a single viewing. We envision ministry partnerships that allow the film to be paired with:

- Group discussions
- Testimony nights
- Small group or recovery ministry conversations
- Faith-based outreach initiatives

We believe this story can serve as a bridge—between Scripture and lived experience, between belief and obedience, between people who feel confident in their faith and those who feel weary, distant, or unsure.

We invite ministry leaders and organizations to prayerfully consider whether this story aligns with the work God has entrusted to them. If it does, we would be honored to walk together in releasing it—not as entertainment alone, but as a catalyst for reflection, conversation, and spiritual growth.
